# WHAT WE DO

As one of the oldest cycling teams in the Midwest, Team Kaos is active in all facets of the sport. We take pride in our efforts and our standing among local and regional cycling teams as leaders in the peloton and in the community.



## ROAD

The bulk of Team Kaos' legacy was made on the pavement of Lincoln, Omaha and atop various podiums across the Midwest. Chris Spence won his seventh Cat. 1/2 Nebraska State Championship last season, and the team has produced four professional cyclists in the last four years. Team president Rich Pearson rode in the masters national championship race last season in Louisville, Ky.



## CYCLOCROSS

Much like the rapid growth of the multi-dimensional discipline itself, Team Kaos has been making gains in cyclocross in recent years. Matt Farnham has been a consistent podium presence in the Cat. 1/2/3 men's races — including a win at the Flatwater Grand Prix last fall — and Rich Pearson placed seventh in his age group at the national championships in Bend, Ore.

## MOUNTAIN

Though numbers have historically been small on the dirt for Team Kaos, a group of new riders will carry the flag for the squad in 2011. Kevin Limpach (right), Andrew Keffer, Ted Lechnowsky and John Rokke — all experienced and successful off-road riders — will form the core of Kaos' dirt efforts.



## TRIATHLON

Much like cyclocross, triathlon is growing rapidly, and Team Kaos is along for the ride. Several members, including Lou Andersen, participate in multi-sport events. As the sport grows further, Team Kaos hopes to expand its reach into the multi-sport arena.



## COMMUNITY SERVICE

Year after year, Team Kaos continues its strong tradition of community service. In cooperation with title sponsor Alegent Health several team members participated in a series of health fairs, and others assisted with or participated in benefit rides such as the Corporate Cycling Challenge and Tour de Cure.
